Intern Title: Advanced Conservation Intern: Paper

Overview: This internship will focus on allowing the advanced student in paper conservation to carry out a vast amount of varying conservation treatments. The collections to be conserved include works of art on paper, documents, blue prints, and archives. The collections may also include books or photographs depending on the intern's experience coming into the internship. The intern will function as a member of the conservation department and will carry out their own examination, documentation, treatment, and dialogues with curatorial staff. The Advanced Paper Conservation Intern will train and supervise other conservation interns to carry out basic paper conservation steps.

Level of responsibility: Reports to Chief Conservator

Qualifications:

- The qualified intern will have completed two years of a master's program in conservation as a major in paper conservation.

Institutional Goals and Benefits: To participate in the training of conservation professionals. Further the conservation treatment of Center of the West collections.
