TOURS FOR PRESCHOOLS

The Buffalo Bill Center of the West is a great place to explore and learn! We are inviting all area preschools to the Center at **NO CHARGE** this school year. WHAT ANIMALS EAT

Animals in the Yellowstone Ecosystem eat a variety of foods. Students will learn what it means to be an herbivore, carnivore, or omnivore. They will also begin to explore what a healthy diet for humans can look like.

Tour Length: 45 min

LET'S MAKE MUSIC

Music is integral to human culture. During this tour, students will learn how sounds turn into music, and how music is created and expressed in many different ways. Students will learn the sounds animals make; they will explore the music-making instruments European immigrants brought with them and adopted when they moved into the area; and lastly, they will learn the instruments the indigenous people of the area use to make music. **Tour length:** 1 hour

LITTLE EXPLORER'S ART TOUR

Designed to engage young minds, this tour through the Whitney Western Art Museum will help preschoolers appreciate different forms of art. Students will participate in activities that help them describe and interpret art, as well as learning to develop an individual opinion on chosen pieces in the museum. **Tour length:** 45 minutes.

Animal families come in all shapes and sizes, just like ours do! Students will learn about different family structures that exist amongst our animal neighbors. They will begin to understand some different roles the animals have in raising young, and providing food for the families. **Tour length:** 45 minutes
