

# Invisible Boundaries:

## Exploring Yellowstone's Great Animal Migrations

In 2013, the Buffalo Bill Center of the West's Draper Natural History Museum and University of Wyoming's Biodiversity Institute teamed up with the Prince Albert II of Monaco Foundation to create the \$100,000 Camp Monaco Prize to support and encourage innovative, transboundary research and education in Greater Yellowstone. The inaugural prize was awarded in 2013 to Arthur Middleton and Joe Riis, and led to this exhibition.

The exhibition was organized by the Buffalo Bill Center of the West, Cody, Wyoming, with partners at the Yale School of Forestry and Environmental Studies and the Wyoming Migration Initiative, and designed and produced by Split Rock Studios, St. Paul, Minnesota.
